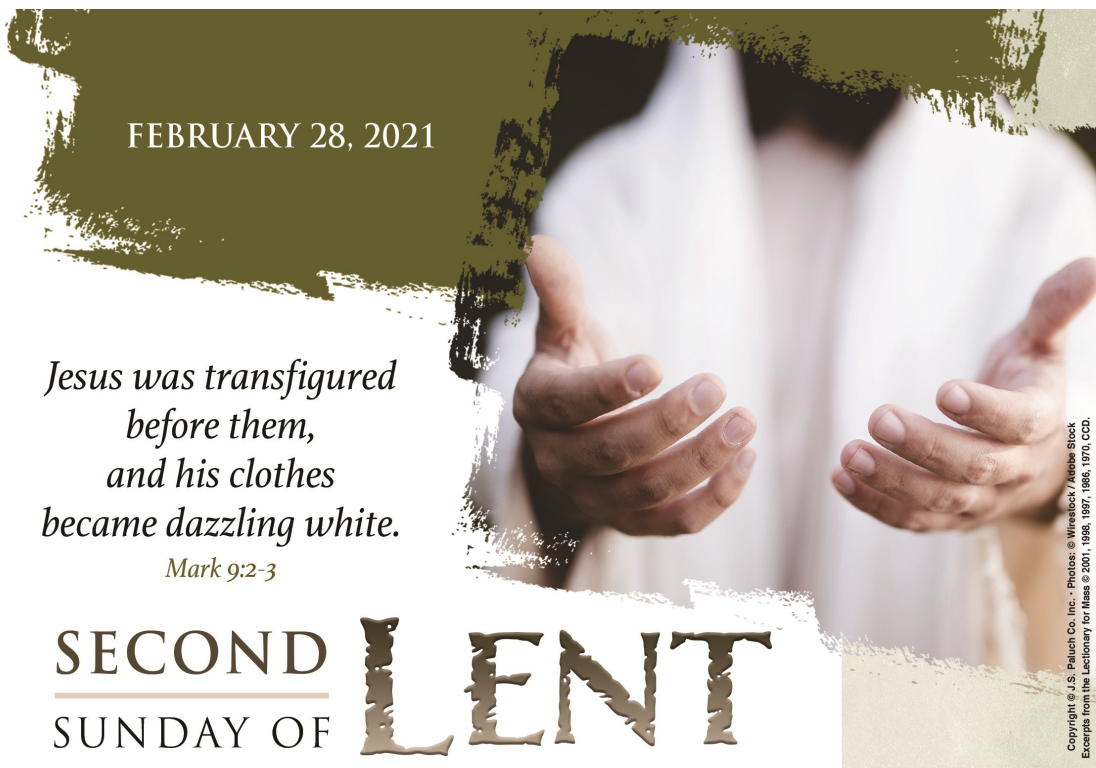

FROM THE PASTOR

Second Sunday of Lent

Today's message from the Word of God clearly speaks of Jesus' triumph. The triumph of Jesus is a perfect message during the Lenten Season. It tells us that because of the triumph of Jesus by His death on the Holy Cross, through Him and with Him, we can also be triumphant in our battle against evil.

In the days of Noah, the people throughout the world had become very evil, practicing all kinds of abominations that offended the Lord God. Because of this, God told Noah to build an ark and to gather his family and two of every kinds of animals. When the days of the flooding were over and the ark had touched land, Noah, his family and all the animals left the ark. Then, God spoke to Noah and to his sons.

God promised to establish a Covenant with Noah and all his descendants. God promised that never again would He flood the entire world to destroy every living thing on the earth. As a sign of His promise, He gave the rainbow to the world for all to see in the sky.

Now, the flooding of the world is symbolic of the Sacrament of Baptism. Also, the flooding of the world was prophetic of our Baptism that was to come by the power of the Holy Spirit. This is especially noticeable by the Words of God when He said, 'never again' would He flood the world. The Words 'never again' are a sign that God is appeased through the Sacrament of Baptism. For through this Church Sacrament, we triumph over Satan by the grace of God the Father, the power of the Holy Spirit and our faith in the atoning sacrifice of the Lord Jesus Christ.

In the Gospel of Mark, when Jesus was accused of casting out demons by the power of Beelzebul, He spoke of this triumph.

In other words, Jesus was announcing that Satan would be tied down. The Kingdom of God would begin its growth on earth.

DEL PARROCO

Segundo domingo de cuaresma AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA

Llamamos "ayuno" a la privación voluntaria de comida durante algún tiempo por motivo religioso, como acto de culto ante Dios.

En la Biblia el ayuno puede ser señal de penitencia, expiación de los pecados, oración intensa o voluntad firme de conseguir algo. Otras veces, como en los cuarenta días de Moisés en el monte o de Elías en el desierto o de Jesús antes de empezar su misión, subraya la preparación intensa para un acontecimiento importante.

El ayuno es símbolo y expresión de una renuncia a todo aquello que nos impide realizar en nosotros el proyecto de Dios.

Junto con el desierto y la oración, el ayuno parece ser una de las mediaciones privilegiadas de todo tiempo penitencial, de revisión de vida y de búsqueda sincera de Dios. Sin embargo, los profetas Joel e Isaías nos indican el verdadero sentido de esta antigua práctica penitencial:

"Vuelvan a mí de todo corazón, con ayuno, llantos y lamentos. Desgarren su corazón y no sus vestiduras, y vuelvan al Señor, su Dios". (Joel 2, 12-18)

"Este es el ayuno que yo amo, oráculo del Señor: soltar las cadenas injustas, desatar los lazos del yugo, dejar en libertad a los oprimidos y romper todos los yugos; compartir tu pan con el hambriento y albergar a los pobres sin techo; cubrir al que veas desnudo..." (Isaías 58, 6-9)

El ayuno debe ser un gesto de solidaridad efectiva con los que pasan hambre (es decir, ayunan forzosamente) trabajando por la eliminación de toda la injusticia en la vida personal y social, y por la liberación de toda opresión, explotación y corrupción.

We, God's baptized children, are living proof of the presence of the spiritual Kingdom of God on earth. Through the Holy Catholic Church, we as living stones, God's chosen people, a holy priesthood, are united as one in the Body of Christ.

The Sacrament of Baptism does not remove the dirt from our physical bodies for our bodies are called to die. But, it is an appeal to God for a good conscience through the resurrection of Jesus Christ who has completed His work on earth and who is now sitting at the right hand of the Father. There, all the angels, the authorities and the powers are subject to Him, He who has all authority over all of creation.

Jesus triumphed over disobedience, rebellion and persecution. Through His triumph, we can also be triumphant.

During today's Gospel, we heard how Jesus was triumphant over Satan. While in the wilderness for forty days (this being a symbolic number), Satan tempted Him. Jesus did not allow Himself to be seduced by Satan. He came on earth to overthrow the worldly kingdom of Satan that had its beginning when Adam disobeyed God in the Garden of Eden. Jesus came on earth to reclaim God's Kingdom that was rightfully His, but stolen by Satan through sin.

Today's Gospel Reading finished with Jesus announcing in Galilee, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'

As members of the Kingdom of God, during the Lenten Season, we are called to repent of our sins that offend God. We are called to frequently remember the triumph of Jesus. We are called to triumphantly live our faith in Christ as baptized children of God. We are called to go forward and shine by our obedience, our servitude, our charity towards others, through prayers, sacrifices, all in the love of God.

 - La abstinencia consiste en no comer carne.
 - Son días de abstinencia y ayuno: Miércoles de Ceniza y Viernes Santo.
 - La abstinencia obliga a partir de los 14 años.
 - El ayuno de los 18 hasta los 59.
 - Con estos sacrificios, se trata de que todo nuestro ser (espíritu, alma y cuerpo) participe en un acto donde reconozcan la necesidad de hacer obras con las que reparemos el daño ocasionado con nuestros pecados y para el bien de la Iglesia.
- Ayuna de juzgar a otros. Descubre a Cristo que vive en ellos.

Ayuna de palabras hirientes. Llénate de frases sanadoras.

Ayuna de descontento. Llénate de gratitud.

Ayuna de enojos. Llénate de paciencia.

Ayuna de pesimismo. Llénate de esperanza cristiana.

Ayuna de preocupaciones. Llénate de confianza en Dios.

Ayuna de quejarte. Llénate de aprecio por la maravilla que es la vida.

Ayuna de las presiones. Llénate de una oración que no cesa.

Ayuna de amargura Llénate de perdón.

Ayuna de darte importancia a ti mismo. Llénate de compasión por los demás.

Ayuna de ansiedad sobre tus cosas. Comprométete en la propagación del Reino.

Ayuna de desaliento. Llénate del entusiasmo de la fe.

Ayuna de pensamientos mundanos. Llénate de las verdades que fundamentan la santidad.

Ayuna de todo lo que te separe de Jesús. Llénate de todo lo que te acerque a Él.

El ayuno junto con la oración y la caridad, ha sido desde muy antiguo una "práctica cuaresmal" como signo de la conversión interior a los valores fundamentales del evangelio de Cristo.

Cuaresma: Tiempo de preparación para la pascua del Señor mediante la oración, el ayuno y la entrega de nuestro prójimo; Tiempo de conversión para volver a Dios Padre misericordioso.
